Thank you for your inquiry. Below you will find the response to your original submitted question(s).

The following question was submitted:

The question has arisen in imaging CT regarding the "imaging bulk pack" (Isovue) that is being used as a contrast medication drawn up aseptically with the bulk pack remaining in the room and separate syringes being utilized on multiple patients. This product has FDA approval for packaging, but again the concern in multiple patient use from a single source. The bulk pack remains in the room during various patients and exams.

The Joint Commission response:

Isovue Imaging Bulk Package is a specific combination multi-patient, multi-dose compliant contrast medium. It is approved by the FDA for point of care use in CT. A bulk contrast package is not considered to be a multi-dose vial (MDV) as there is no preservative in the container therefore it has a short time that it can actually be used. MDV guidelines do not apply.
